In writing the following words to be read by you, where you are now, I hope to have embroidered into them something of a trace of autumn 2022. Be it the protests across the UK drawing attention to the soaring cost of living and impacts of the climate crisis. Or the words of daring protesters in Iran sweeping internationally with the call to action 'women, life, freedom'. Perhaps the continued coverage of the Russia-Ukraine war?

Your engagement with Congress in Salisbury on the 29th October will be unique to you, it will become a memory. It will be formed in part by words and phrases trigger your lived experience and perhaps you will infuse with them new thoughts and feelings.

How do you shape your ideas about the world? Late last night I was awake with half-formed thoughts about freedom, confinement and living between languages. As a salve to these I began to sense out my feelings about the future. In that moment the unexpected happened, I felt, and what I felt in my heart was joy. I live in a time and place where I am writing to you from that I can share these words without censoring myself. For that I am grateful. The sunlight is streaming through my window and the warmth of it reminds me that when I need to take life minute to minute it is to nourish the distances I must travel.

Each of us today and in the days to come in the context of our own lives will need to make decisions that impact the everyday and some will continue to resonate through to generations to come. I have been feeling and thinking a lot about how to have conversations that go beyond agreeing to disagree. To engage with making progress be it incremental or a great leap. I am reminded of the words of the poet Jalāl al-Dīn Muhammad Rūmī "Out beyond ideas of wrongdoing and rightdoing there is a field. I'll meet you there."

If you could have the full attention of one person, your local community, the world what of your thoughts and feelings would you want to be heard and understood? I hope to in my lifetime to learn what that might be, and in the meantime, I will be keeping you in mind, dear reader of these words.
